Good Academic Standing Requirement To Live In Residence Halls

BOT Approved: June 19, 2013 Put in new format June 2019; Reviewed and procedures updated by CC August 13, 2019.

PURPOSE:

To ensure that students understand that living in the residence halls is looked upon as a privilege, that the overall environment is conducive to learning, and that all residential students are in good academic standing with the institution

POLICY:

All residential students must be in good academic standing in order to live in Garrett College Residence Halls. Good Academic standing is as follows:

- A student who has attempted 0-15.99 credit hours and earned a CGPA* of 1.50 or above
- A student who has attempted 16-28.99 credit hours and earned CGPA* of 1.75 or above
- A student who has attempted 29+ credit hours and earned CGPA* of 2.00 or above

PROCEDURES:

Students who have been denied residence may file an appeal in writing to the Director of Student Development by January 7 for spring semester housing and by May 31 for fall semester housing.

- All appeals must clearly state the reason for the student's failure to achieve the required cumulative grade point average.
- The student must attend an appeal hearing with the Housing Review Board (time, date, and location to be determined by the Housing Review Board).
- Students whose appeal has been granted will be permitted to live in one of the residence halls but will be on housing probation and may have conditions placed upon them. At the end of the probationary semester the student's probationary status will be reviewed.

The student may return to housing for the upcoming semester but will remain on housing probation until such a time as the student has achieved good academic standing.

Students on housing probation that fail to meet the conditions of their housing probationary status will be dismissed from the residence hall.
